## **2B. Project Description**

### **1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project and how the Collaborative Applicant will use grant funds to comply with the provisions of 24 CFR 578.7.**

1. CA-527 Tehama County Continuum of Care is a relatively new CoC that has covered a single, rural California county since receiving its designation in February of 2015. Through participation in HUD-provided Technical Assistance and the efforts of member organizations and a part-time CoC Coordinator, CA-527 has demonstrated a solid understanding of the purpose and operation of a CoC, has refined the community's response to homelessness through the development and implementation of a robust Coordinated Entry System and the refinement of its written standards, and has paved the way for member organizations to build capacity to better serve individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Tehama County. To ensure continued progress towards its goal of ending homelessness in Tehama County through design of a sustainable system of service delivery that will safely and permanently rehouse persons and families who become homeless, CA-527 is requesting planning funds for FY2017. Funds received will allow CA-527 to maintain the services of its coordinator, whose responsibilities include overseeing scheduling of committee meetings, following up on action items discussed in meetings, curating available information from various relevant resources and disseminating such information to the membership, monitoring evolving compliance requirements and suggesting revisions to CA-527's written standards to ensure continued compliance, maintaining the CoC's website and other communications, providing technical assistance to providers regarding program design and serving as a point of contact for those with which the CoC interacts and partners. In addition to ensuring the continued service of CA-527's coordinator, funds will also make it possible to further expand the CoC's membership, to encourage participation in the CES through demonstration and training events and an assessment and referral drive to be conducted at the community's annual LIFT Event, and to cover costs associated with conducting a community-wide Point-in-Time count of sheltered individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Tehama County in January of 2018

### **2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.**

General coordination activities are ongoing. Planning for the 2018 Sheltered Point-in-Time Count will begin in at the beginning of January 2018 with the count itself scheduled to be conducted in the last week of January 2018. Analysis and reporting on the 2018 Point in Time Count will be conducted from February 2018 to April 2018. Project evaluation will be conducted quarterly, and reporting on outcomes will be presented to the Executive Council following that schedule, as well. Participation in the Consolidated Plan will take place according to the participation and feedback opportunities scheduled by HCD. CoC Application Activities will be conducted according to the NOFA release dates as scheduled by HUD. The Gaps Analysis meeting will occur in

November of 2018 as part of the vendor setup day at the annual LIFT Event in Tehama County and/or as a continuation of 2017's Homeless Stakeholder's workgroup.

**3. How will the requested funds improve the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?**

3. At CA-527's inception, the area included only one project receiving funding through either the CoC or ESG programs – a domestic violence emergency shelter utilizing ESG funds as a subrecipient of the annual ESG award to California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). Little monitoring of HUD funded projects had been conducted by the CoC of which CA-527 was previously a part, so CA-527 was starting from scratch – regarding both acquisition of additional funding and the monitoring of projects. In the short time since, CA-527 has been brought up-to-speed on monitoring requirements, has developed comprehensive policies and procedures for monitoring projects and a schedule for submission and review of regular reports from such projects. As a result of these efforts and the member organizations' participation in and understanding of HCD's redesigned ESG award process, Tehama County's homelessness assistance system now includes a Rapid Rehousing project, operated by Poor and the Homeless Tehama County Coalition (PATH). The project began operation in early 2017 and is poised to receive a second round of ESG funds through the FY2017 Balance of State ESG NOFA released by the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) in August 2017. The ongoing planning process will allow CA-527 to maintain compliance with project monitoring evaluation of project outcomes through the refinement and implementation of this process. The requested funds will allow for further training and assistance for projects performing below benchmarks and will allow them opportunities to gain skills both for improving their programs and for using data available to them internally through the HMIS to gain insight into identifying successful program components as well as areas for improvement.

**4. How will the planning activities continue beyond the expiration of HUD financial assistance?**

4. The intent of the planning activities described herein are to continue developing a system that will remain sustainable despite future changes in funds availability. Expanding the membership of the CoC and the impact of CoC activities in the community will help community leaders understand the problem and see demonstrations of how our collaborative work can actually end homelessness over time and with resources. CA-527 members have been working with community leaders to help them understand how we can make a difference, why it is important for them to support this effort, and to share with them approaches being used by other communities to end homelessness. CA-527 will continue to seek collaborative funding from local foundations similar to the grant that Alternatives to Violence (CA-527's HMIS Lead Agency) and the CoC's coordinator secured from Dignity Health that has made possible development of CA-527's CES. The CoC's Coordinator will continue research into funding opportunities and the Executive Council will identify organizations to apply for funding. The founding members of CA-527 are resourceful in operating on volunteer work and donated space, as is evidenced by the progress made during its first several months as a new CoC with very little

funding. Fortunately, CA-527's initial efforts are increasingly gaining the confidence and support of several community entities, and this support is likely to grow as successful collaborations are further developed.
